A world renowned institution, NHS Golden Jubilee has provided care through collaboration for patients from all across Scotland since 2002.

Consisting of the Golden Jubilee University National Hospital, Research Institute, Conference Hotel, Centre for Sustainable Delivery and NHS Scotland Academy, NHS Golden Jubilee works with colleagues around the globe, from industry to academia, to provide the highest quality of person centred care.

Golden Jubilee University National Hospital

As Scotland's flagship hospital for elective and specialist care, we are home to Scotland's largest ophthalmology centre, one of Europe's biggest elective orthopaedic centres and a major diagnostic imaging service.

NHS Golden Jubilee also manages all heart and lung surgery for the west of Scotland, as well as 3 national heart and lung services, including the country's only adult heart transplantation unit.

Our Highlights



Performed 119,898 procedures in 2023/24:

- 28,605 elective procedures in orthopaedics, cataracts, general surgery, colorectal, scopes and scans.
- 91,243 cardiology, cardiac and thoracic procedures.



Carried out 29 adult heart transplants in 2023/24.



Continue to provide life-saving Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation (TAVI) procedures for patients who cannot have open heart surgery. Reached 1,500 TAVI procedures in 2023/24.



Carried out approximately 30% of all cataract and orthopaedic procedures in NHS Scotland in 2023/24.



Lung surgery team routinely meet the 31-day cancer target for patients.



First NHS hospital in Scotland to be accredited by the Royal College of Physicians' Joint Advisory Group (JAG) on Gastrointestinal (GI) Endoscopy - a measure of excellence used to underpin all aspects of a high-quality endoscopy service.



Opened our new Surgical Centre to support waiting times across NHS Scotland.



Innovation and Research



The first Hospital in Scotland to use a Da Vinci robot to carry out lung surgery.



Performed 4,771 robotic orthopaedic joint replacement procedures in 2023/24.



Performed the first Meniscal Transplant in Scotland, potentially benefitting thousands of younger patients every year.



First Scottish site to carry out a Transcatheter Pulmonary Valve Replacement - replacing a patient's heart valve through a vein in his leg, avoiding the need for open-heart surgery.



First in the world to treat a patient with an Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator using an MRI scanner.



Pioneered enhanced recovery for hip and knee replacements, getting patients up and on their feet on the day of surgery, now accepted as the gold standard across NHS Scotland.



Led on the pioneering COVID-RV study, becoming the first in the world to confirm that COVID-19 is associated with impaired function of the right side of the heart, changing the landscape for future pandemics and potentially fatal heart and lung issues generally.



A proven track record in international research studies, including CUPID2, SERCA2a, PRAMI and T-Time.



First Scottish NHS Board to perform Endoscopic Vein Harvesting (EVH), a much less invasive procedure for taking a vein from your leg to use as part of a coronary artery bypass graft to limit damage and improve recovery times.

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NHS Scotland Academy

The NHS Scotland Academy (NHSS Academy) is an ambitious joint venture between NHS Education for Scotland (NES) and NHS Golden Jubilee (NHS GJ). It supports the transformation and sustainability of the health and social care workforce through the development and delivery of new accelerated learning and development offerings for key roles.

Since opening in 2021, the Academy has achieved some incredible milestones to support NHS Scotland.

National Impact



23,915 staff have completed or are part-way through NHSS Academy programmes so far.



Developed 4 national training programmes to get staff into key roles quicker than ever before.



Surgical First Assistant training previously took more than 1 year, and can now be completed in just 34 weeks.



Foundations of Perioperative Practice programme is now down to just 34 weeks, compared to 18 months previously.



The National Endoscopy Training Programme has now allowed 666 endoscopists to be upskilled, providing a higher quality of care for patients across Scotland and playing a key role in tackling waiting times.



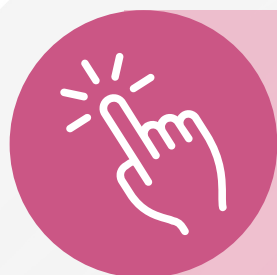
The National Ultrasound Training Programme offers 5 weeks of immersive and hands on experience at the Golden Jubilee University National Hospital, taking pressure off other Boards to provide training. Over 17,400 patients have had an ultrasound through the immersion training programme, with priority being given to patients from Boards with the longest wait times.



Approximately 2,007 community pharmacists have attended the National Clinical Skills for Pharmacists Programme giving them the skills to assess, advise and treat a range of patients for minor illnesses and common clinical conditions.



Preparing for Work in the NHS



Developed and launched the Preparing for Work in Health and Social Care Programme. This digital resource has now been accessed by over 15,505 people across Scotland who are new or returning to work in health and social care (care homes, dental practices, hospices, NHS Boards etc).



Over 1,792 international nurses recruited into Scotland have used Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) preparation resources.

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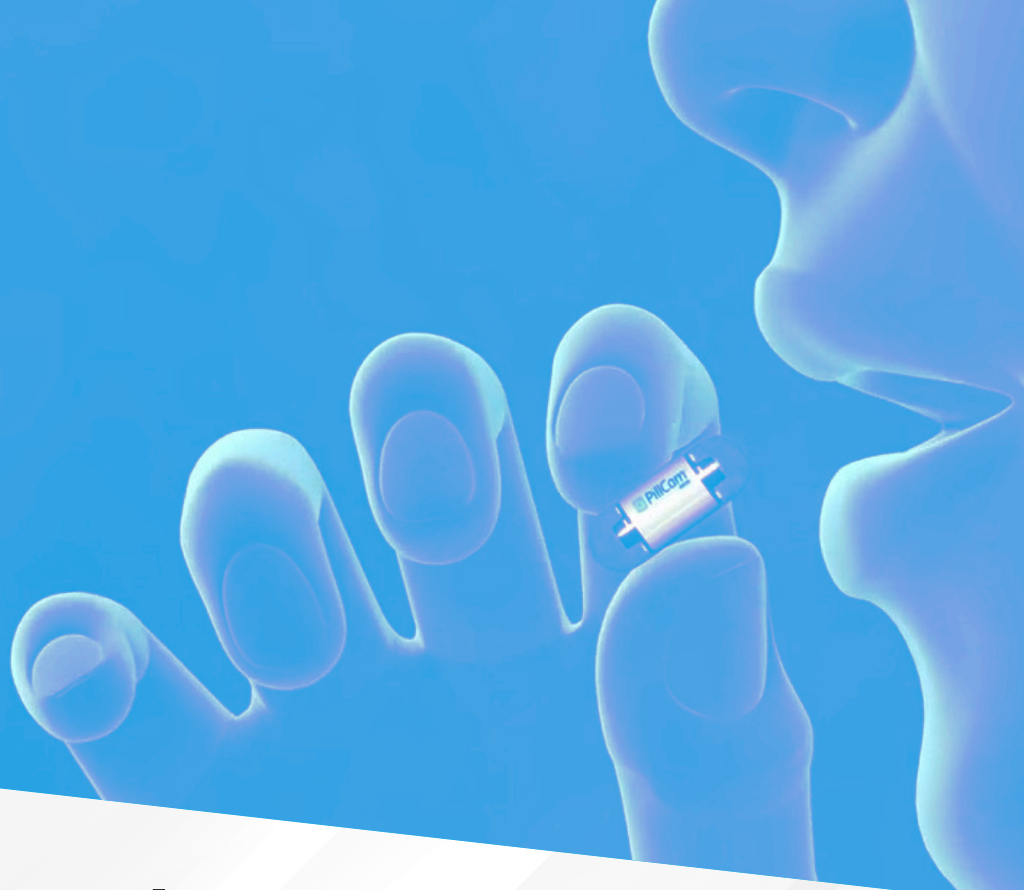
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Centre for Sustainable Delivery

Hosted by NHS Golden Jubilee and commissioned by the Scottish Government, the national Centre for Sustainable Delivery (CfSD) is a national unit designed to sustainably improve and transform Scotland's health care system through innovation, collaboration and clinical leadership.

Building on the significant progress and developments which have already been achieved through redesign and transformation, CfSD also supports the rapid rollout of new techniques, innovations and clinically safe, fast and efficient pathways for Scotland's patients.



Work to date



Lead on the programme of work which resulted in Desflurane, a highly volatile and damaging anaesthetic gas, being removed from the NHS Scotland supply chain. This is a world first in aiming to reduce the impact of hospital theatres on the environment, and part of the National Green Theatres Programme.

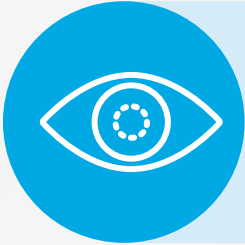


Launched the NHS Scotland Lung Cancer and Head and Neck Diagnostic Pathways. These help ensure patients receive faster access to the treatment they need, when they need it.

These redesigned services set clear timeframes to ensure that most patients receive their diagnosis by day 21, with the majority undergoing treatment by day 42.



Played a key role in the development of Scotland's first Rapid Cancer Diagnostic Services. These provide primary care with a fast track diagnostic pathway for patients with non-specific symptoms that do not meet existing guidelines. There are now 5 of these services in place in NHS Fife, Dumfries & Galloway, Ayrshire and Arran, Lanarkshire and NHS Borders.



Published 'Improving the Delivery of Cataract Surgery in Scotland: a Blueprint for Success' to support Boards to deliver high quality, high volume, specialist care on a sustainable basis.



Pushing forward the ground breaking Colon Capsule Endoscopy (CCE) service, a technology where patients obtain scope results by simply swallowing a small pill that takes 50,000 pictures of the bowel as it passes through the digestive system, helping to identify early signs of cancer.



Developed and rolled out the Accelerated National Innovation Adoption (ANIA) pathway, to speed up the development, assessment and effective rollout of proven technological solutions into Scotland's healthcare frontline.



Following a £6 million investment from the Scottish Government, ANIA is now leading the development of life changing innovations including Digital Diabetes Remission Programmes and ground breaking genetics testing for stroke patients and newborns.



Lead on the development and rollout of the new Digital Dermatology (skin) pathway, allowing the capture and inclusion of triage quality images as part of a primary care referral process. This is now rolling out to all health boards, offering significantly faster diagnosis and treatment.
